The New Shearman Fine Arts Building

It has been a long time in coming, but the new Shearman Fine Arts Building is now near completion. With over 60,000 square feet under roof, the new building will almost double the space for the departments of performing arts and visual arts. The performing arts theatre will include a state-of-the-art orchestra pit, side stage, back stage, cat-walk and lighting system, and include a 500-person seating capacity. Classes will transition to the new building beginning this summer with the building fully operational in Fall, 2010.
