Last Will and Testament

Provisions for a specific percentage of assets or allocation of funds through a Last Will and Testament ensures your gift to the McNeese Foundation is secure.

Bequest Language

The official bequest language for the McNeese Foundation is:

"I, [name], of [city, state, zip], give, devise and bequeath to The McNeese Foundation [written amount or percentage of the estate or description of property] for its unrestricted use and purpose."



Donor-Directed Planned Gifts

As a member of *The 1939 Living Oak Society*, you may choose to direct your gifts to a specific area.

Membership Requirements
